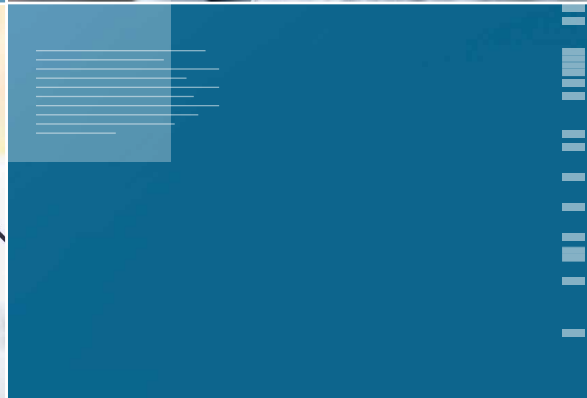
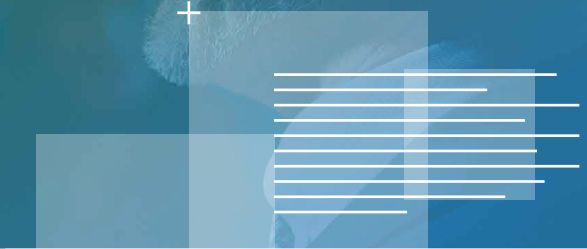

Application Process & Guidelines

Sponsorship Fees **\$8,000 – Report presented twice, once each day to different audiences**

- Sponsorship fees DO NOT INCLUDE REGISTRATION FEES FOR YOUR SPEAKERS. Registration fee for each speaker will be \$2,175 (up to a maximum of three speakers). No limit to the number of registrations for additional employees from your company.
- Reports are 55 minutes long

\$6,000 – Report presented once
